MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION OF FUND PERFORMANCE

Investment Objective and Strategies

The fundamental investment objective of Sun Life Trimark Canadian Class (the “Fund”) is to seek to achieve consistent long-term capital appreciation primarily by investing directly in common securities of Canadian companies or indirectly by investing in mutual funds (including exchange-traded funds) that invest in such securities.

The Fund’s sub-advisor is Invesco Canada Ltd. (the “sub-advisor”). The sub-advisor currently intends to achieve the Fund’s investment objectives by investing all, or substantially all, of the assets of the Fund in units of Trimark Canadian Fund (the “underlying Trust Fund”), a mutual fund that is managed and advised by the sub-advisor. In pursuing the underlying Trust Fund’s investment objectives, the sub-advisor seeks to employ a rigorous, bottom-up fundamental investment approach, analyzing the quality and value of individual companies. The sub-advisor seeks companies whose management has strong entrepreneurial skills or the ability to recognize and exploit opportunities for business expansion. In addition, the sub-advisor seeks companies that have a competitive advantage in their respective industries that is expected to provide opportunities for long-term growth.

Risk

There were no changes in the Fund’s investment objective or strategy during the period which materially impacted the overall level of risk in the Fund. The risks associated with investing in the Fund remain as outlined in the Fund’s Simplified Prospectus.

Results of Operations

The Fund has a performance inception date of March 27, 2015. The period covered in this report is from the inception date to December 31, 2015. The net asset value of the Fund increased from \$0.2 million to \$0.7 million at the end of the period. The increase in net asset value was attributable to positive net sales, partially offset by negative performance in the period.

During the period, the Fund returned -20.8% for Series A shares. This result trailed the Fund’s blended benchmark (65% S&P/TSX Composite Index and 35% MSCI World C\$ Index), which returned -4.4%. The performance returns of other series of this Fund are similar to those of Series A except for differences in expense structures. Please refer to the ‘Past Performance’ section of this report for performance of each series.

The Fund currently invests substantially all of its holdings in the underlying Trust Fund. The following commentary relates to the underlying Trust Fund.

Top detractors from underlying Trust Fund performance over the period included Energy companies Bonavista Energy Corp., Crew Energy Inc., and EnCana Corp. Share prices in the sector declined over the period on continued weakness in both oil and gas prices and extreme negative sentiment towards Energy given a very uncertain near-term outlook. The sub-advisor remains comfortable with the underlying Trust Fund’s Energy positions. The sub-advisor favours investments in the sectors that own high-quality and low-cost assets, possess strong balance sheets to withstand an extended period of low commodity prices and are run by competent management teams. The sub-advisor believes, based on their medium- to long-term view of normalized commodity prices that reflect the marginal cost of supply, that valuations in the Energy sector are extremely compelling.

Another detractor, Teck Resources fell as commodity prices continued to weaken over the period. The company announced its plans to idle several of its coal mines in response to slumping demand and excess supply. Given current conditions, the sub-advisor views these actions as prudent and positive, and believes that current valuations offer attractive return potential for investors with a long-term view.

A key contributor to performance includes shares of Toromont Industries Ltd., a distributor of construction equipment (e.g., Caterpillar) and industrial and recreational refrigeration systems, rose over the period as the company reported better-than-expected results buoyed by growth in both its equipment and refrigeration systems units. The company is one of the world’s largest Caterpillar dealerships, servicing the mining, forestry, industrial, agriculture, marine and power-generation industries.

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Another contributor, Jabil Circuit designs, develops and manufactures electronic components for companies in a wide variety of industries, including Telecommunications, Automotive, Aerospace and Health Care. Shares of the company rose during the period after the company reported better-than-expected results raised its guidance for the upcoming year. The company's results were driven by strong demand from handset manufacturers (notably, its largest customer is Apple Inc.).

E.I. du Pont de Nemours and Co., Burberry Group PLC, AutoCanada Inc., WESCO International, Inc., Generac Holdings Inc., Melco Crown Entertainment Ltd., Harley-Davidson, Inc., AG Growth International Inc. and Crescent Point Energy Corp. were new purchases for the underlying Trust Fund that met the sub-advisor's investment criteria.

Jabil Circuit Inc., MBAC Fertilizer Corp., Polypore International Inc., Potash Corp. of Saskatchewan Inc., Suncor Energy Inc., Volkswagen AG, Rolls-Royce Holdings PLC, and Thomson Reuters Corp. were sold. Generally, businesses are sold when they reach full valuation; if new, relatively more attractive investment opportunities exist; or if new information arises that changes the sub-advisor's thesis on the future of a business.

Recent Developments

The state of flux that characterizes Energy markets today is being reflected in valuations of companies within the sector. The sub-advisor maintains prevailing oil prices are well below levels required to maintain production at current levels and, as such, productive capacity should fall over time until oil prices reach more sustainable levels.

Oil-and-gas producers have suffered disproportionately relative to the decline in oil prices and valuations of the group have reached distressed levels. The sub-advisor is finding compelling risk/reward scenarios in this space and has been concentrating the underlying Trust Fund's Energy holdings in companies that the sub-advisor believes have attractive economics (to weather an environment of lower energy prices), strong financial positions (to weather a protracted adjustment to current conditions) and attractive growth profiles (which are being heavily discounted).

The sub-advisor does not profess to know when oil prices will improve but are encouraged by developments occurring in the industry that suggest the Energy market is moving towards sustainability. That said, continued global macroeconomic concerns as seen early in 2016 and other factors, including geopolitical risks and monetary policies, could continue to depress valuations of commodity stocks and equities for some time.

The efficacy of the sub-advisor's discipline in times of past market turmoil underpins the underlying Trust Fund's

positioning today. The sub-advisor maintains that having a long-term view and taking advantage of attractive risk/reward opportunities should prove beneficial over the long term.

Related Party Transactions

Sun Life Global Investments (Canada) Inc. (the "Manager") is the manager and portfolio manager of the Fund.

The Manager is responsible for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day-to-day operations, including providing or arranging for the provision of investment advice, bookkeeping, recordkeeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

For its services, the Manager receives a management fee that is calculated as a percentage of the average net asset value of the Fund. This fee is calculated daily and payable monthly.

As portfolio manager, the Manager is responsible for managing the investment portfolio of the Fund directly or through sub-advisors. The Manager has retained Invesco Canada Ltd. to act as a sub-advisor for the Fund.

The Manager is an indirect wholly owned subsidiary of Sun Life Financial Inc.

Fund Administrative Expenses

The Manager pays certain of the operating expenses of each Fund (the "Administration Expenses") in return for a fixed administration fee paid to the Manager by each Fund ("Administration Fee"). The Administration Fee is based on the net asset value of each series of the Fund. The Administration Expenses include, but are not limited to, record keeper fees, accounting, audit and legal fees, bank and interest charges, safekeeping and custodial fees, taxes, administrative and systems costs, costs of reports to investors, prospectuses and other disclosure documents, regulatory filing fees (including those incurred by the Manager) and trustee fees for registered plans. The amount of this charge is disclosed as a fund administrative expense in the Fund's Statement of Comprehensive Income found in the annual financial statements (audited).

Each Fund also pays certain operating expenses directly (the "Fund Costs"). Fund Costs include: borrowing costs incurred by the Fund from time to time; costs in connection with portfolio transactions; fees and expenses payable to or in connection with the Fund's Independent Review Committee ("IRC"); taxes payable by the Fund; and the costs of complying with any new regulatory or legal requirement imposed on the Fund. Each Fund allocates Fund Costs proportionately among its series of shares. The Fund Costs that are specific to a series of shares are allocated to that series. These amounts are paid out of the assets attributed to

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each series of shares of the Fund, which reduces the return you may receive.

Series Description

The Fund offers the following series of shares: A, AT5, E, F, I and O. The date of creation for all series was March 27, 2015.

Series A and AT5 shares are available to all investors.

Series AT5 shares are designed to provide investors with a fixed monthly cash distribution based upon a target annualized distribution rate of 5% of the net asset value per share as at the end of the prior year.

Series E shares are available to investors through the Private Client program and must be purchased through a Private Client account. Investors in Series E shares are eligible for management fee reductions, if any, based on the value of Series E shares held in their Private Client account. Any management fee reduction will be paid to investors as a fee distribution by the Fund, which will be reinvested in additional Series E shares. As announced on December 15, 2015, in connection with changes to the Private Client Program, all Series E shares will be converted to Series A shares on February 5, 2016. Please refer to the Fund's simplified prospectus for more details about the captioned change and for details about the Private Client Program.

Series F shares are available to investors who have a fee-based account with their dealer and whose dealer has signed an agreement with the Manager. Instead of paying sales charges, investors buying Series F shares pay fees to their dealer for investment advice and other services. The Manager does not pay any commissions to dealers in respect of Series F shares, so the Manager can charge a lower management fee.

Series I shares are special purpose securities that are currently only available to other mutual funds and eligible institutional investors. Series I shares are not sold to the general public. Each Series I investor negotiates its own management and advisory fee that is paid directly to the Manager.

Series O shares are available to investors through the Private Client program and must be purchased through a Private Client account. Each Series O investor pays a management fee directly to the Manager and is eligible for management fee reductions, if any, based on the value of Series O shares held in the investor's Private Client account. Series O management fee is paid, after subtracting any management fee reductions, by a redemption of Series O shares in the investor's account.

Management Fees

The annual maximum management fee paid by the Fund is a percentage of the average daily net asset value of each series exclusive of any applicable taxes and operating expenses, which is accrued daily and is paid to the Manager monthly in arrears. Management fees pay for portfolio and investment advisory services, oversight of any service providers,

marketing and promotional activities, arranging for the distribution and sale of securities of the Fund, general administration of fund operations and sales and trailing commissions paid to dealers.

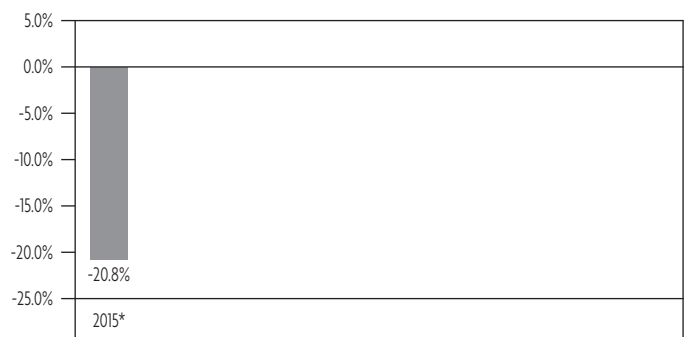
PAST PERFORMANCE

Year-by-Year Returns

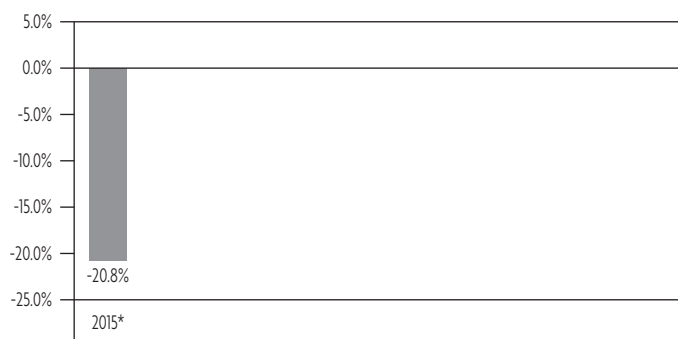

Series A Shares – Annual return for the period ended December 31, 2015

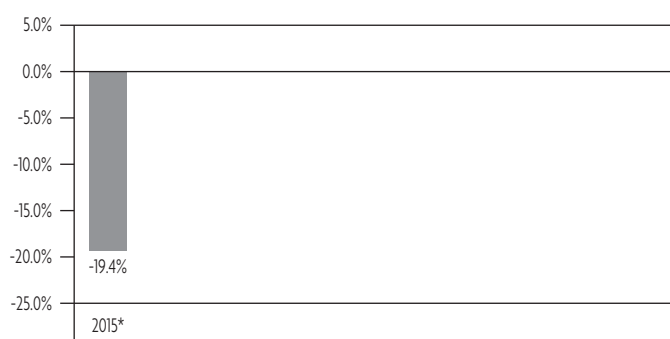


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Series AT5 Shares – Annual return for the period ended December 31, 2015

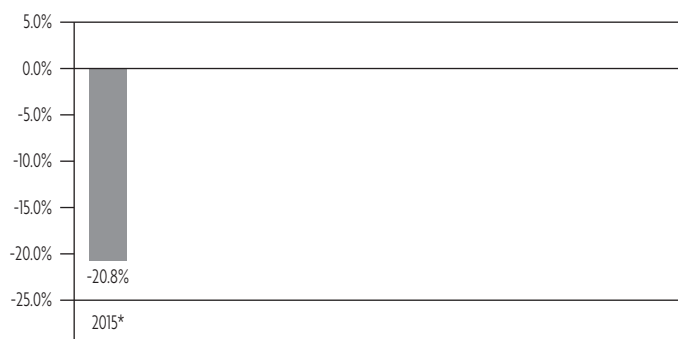


Series O Shares – Annual return for the period ended December 31, 2015

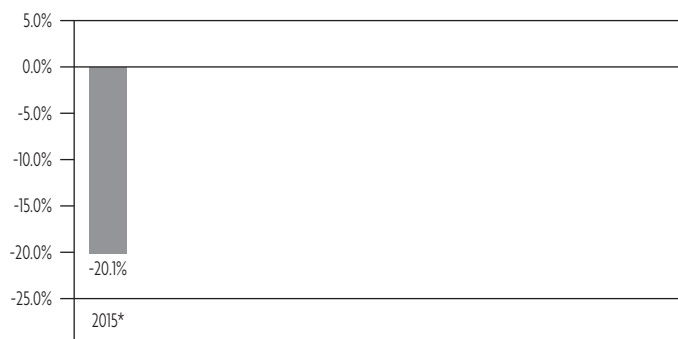

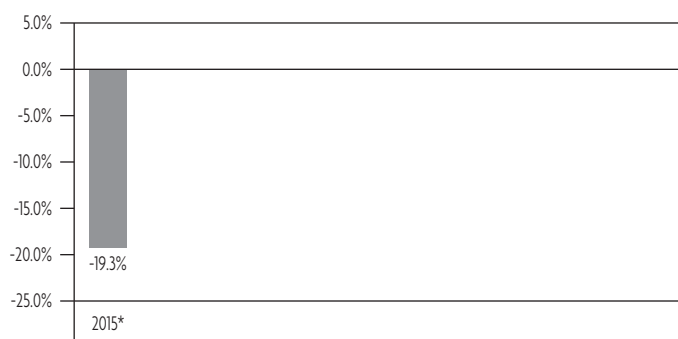
